A special meeting of the council of the Village of Antwerp was held on June 30, 1980 with Mayor Zedaker presiding. Council members Butyok, Hill, Price and Johnson were present with Deemer and DeLong absent. Also present was Board of Public Affairs members Monty Cornell and water superintendent Dick Rhoad. The meeting was called by the engineering firm for the purpose of finding solutions to the water problems. Ken Smith and Bill Hodgins were present representing Fink-binner, Pettis and Strout. Mr. Smith gave a short history of the project. He then discussed parts of the contract, and what is presently happening with the system. Hodgins gave a report from his log covering all the problems that has occurred at the plant. Smith recommended 4 steps to get the plant to produce good water.

- 1. Eqipment must be reliable enough to operate 3 or 4 days without break down.
- 2. Village must have chlorination and soda ash working.
- 3. 8" of green sand must be replaced in the filters.
- 4. A General Filter representative must be called in for adjustment and instruction.

Mayor Zedaker asked Mr. Smith a question which has been asked by many citizens, "Why did you recommend last payment to Zachrich?" Smith said that sufficient work had been completed to recommend payments and the \$10,000 being retained was sufficient.

Mr. Smith then addressed the problem of the collapsed wall. He felt the responsibility was shared 3 ways. The engineers should have designed it heavier. The village needs to keep the filters clean and the contractors' agent - General Filter recommended lime which caused the damage. The Mayor and council felt the village had no obligation whatsoever. Price questioned why the engineers used figures from tests taken in 1977 rather than running new tests. Johnson questioned the workmanship on the wall. A representative from Bonded Chemical addressed the question of the chlorination. The chlorinator installed was not the one recommended. The main reason for using the one installed was the availability of parts.

At 8:23 pm Deemer entered the meeting. -

Steve Zachrich, representing Zachrich Const. and representatives from Babcock Plumbing were present and addressed the council. He first felt the wall had been constructed according to design specifications. As soon as the chlorine problem is regulated, he will bring the General Filter representative back. Deemer addressed the plumbing contractors and wanted to know if they felt the eqipment would do the job. They felt the eqipment would produce good water.

Smith stated that the contractor must operate the system for 10 days first and then it must be turned over to the village for 20 days of operation and instructions.

Deemer feels that if the system is not producing by August 15th, the village should take the matter to court.

The problems of the collapsed wall was solved by Steve Zachrich agreeing to reconstruct the wall as specified. Ken Smith agreed to pay for additional grouting and rebar wire for repenforcing. Zachrich will get all pumps working, replace 8" of green sand and will bring the General Filter representative back. The village will get well no. 3 back in operation.

There being no further business, Butyok moved to adjourn the meeting.

On September 2nd Pat Williamson from EPA office took The EPA issued a news release on September 3rd tests samples. rescinding the boil order. The clerk read the letter received September 5th. The meeting was called to hear a water project report from Frank DuByne, technical supervisor, and to pass further legislation for the sewer project.

A large group of Antwerp citizens were present to hear the water Mr. DuByne gave a report as to his findings since being employed by the Village. He reported on some of his findings. A stuck overflow valve was found and has been corrected. The entire town plus the Weatherhead Co. was checked for leaks. The Weatherhead Co. was found to not have any leaks but the village had several which were correted. At 7:45 p.m. DeLong entered the meeting. They are starting to flush all lines to get the bad water out and the good water into the lines. Mr. DuByne is making other recommendations such as: a control meter, recording flow meter, cost study of different chemicals, using raw water for backwashing and the continued flushing of the lines. Mr. DuByne then opened the meeting to questions from the citizens present. Many different questions were asked by the concerned citizens. The topic will again be discussed at the regular Board of Public Affairs meeting on Thursday evening. Attorney Hunt, Mr. Myers and Mr. Grimes, engineers, and Mr. Bank, financial consultant were all present for the sewer project. Mr. Hunt presented Resolution 80-29 which was read by the clerk. DeLong moved and Price seconded to adopt Resolution 80-29, A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF WASTE WATER TREATMENT FACILITIES FOR THE VILLAGE OF ANTWERP, OHIO. The mayor asked for discussion before the vote. Deemer quoted some letters she had from engineers stating that Winzler was "nothing but trouble" and "make sure you have good inspectors". Minutes of Regular Meeting Held October 13, 1980

A regular meeting of Council of the Village of Antwerp was held on October 13, 1980 at 8:00 p.m. in the council chambers. The clerk read the minutes of the regular meeting held September 8th and special meetings held September 22nd and October 6th. They were approved on a motion made by Hill and seconded by Butyok. Roll call as follows: yeas - Hill, Butyok, Price, Johnson, Deemer and Delong; nays - none; motion carried. The due bills of the Village were examined. Deemer questioned why the principal engineer rate was different on the two bills from Kohli & Kaliher. Since their representative was not present those two bills were tabled. The remaining bills were approved on a motion made by Deemer and seconded by Butyok. Roll call as follows: yeas - Hill, Butyok, Price, Johnson, Deemer and Delong; nays - none; motion carried.

The mayor gave the following report. The fines, forfitures and permits for the month were \$587.50. The mayor attended the Mayor's convention in Columbus and also visited the EPA office. Trick or treat will be held on October 31 from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm. He encouraged a positive vote on the two renewal levies for fire 1.8 mill and for current operation 1 mill. Even with these renewals the taxes will be 1 mill less due to removal of the $\frac{1}{2}$ mill for fire truck and $\frac{1}{2}$ mill for street lighting. The white truck in the village with a camera is Winzeler construction taking pictures of all streets. The pre-construction hearing and finalization meeting will be held on \mathbf{Cct} . 13.

Several delinquent EVS bills were discussed with Hill moving and Delong seconding to turn them over to Mr. Spriggs for collection. Roll call as follows: yeas - Hill, Butyok, Price, Johnson, Deemer and Delong; nays - none; motion carried.

The report from the Board of Public Affairs was that Mr. DuByne was still working at the plant and all hydrants had been flushed. Financing and additional work at the water plant was discussed. Butyok moved and Deemer seconded to have the mayor investigate obtaining a FHA grant. Roll call as follows: yeas - Hill, Butyok, Price, Johnson, Deemer and Delong; nays- none; motion carried.

Bill Hunt reported on the remaining sewer easement cases. The Ohler case was held Oct. 2nd with the jury ruling a settlement of \$5,593.00. After the judge reviewed it, he lowered it \$630.00 for a total of \$4,965.60. The village had

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deposited \$1,049.30 so the village would owe the differences. After more discussion Price moved and Butyok seconded to pay the difference of \$3,916.30 for the easement. Roll call as follows: yeas - Hill Butyok, Price, Johnson, Deemer and Delong; nays - none; motion carried. Council then discussed the Utterback easement. After discussion council decided to levy the land for \$7,000.00 on a motion made by Deemer and seconded by Butyok. Roll call as follows: yeas - Hill, Butyok, Price, Johnson, Deemer and Delong; nays - none; metion carried.

A fall clean-up was discussed with Butyok moving to have one. The motion died for a lack of a second.

The mayor discussed that after the first of the year a change of council meet - ing night may be needed to change to the first Monday of the month. This will be discussed later.

Ken Smith was present to discuss the water situation. A letter was read dated October 7th from the engineers. Council had many questions and much discussion about the letter. Price felt that if a study was to be made another engineering firm should be obtained. Deemer reported on checking with General Filter and the need for additional testing before the project was started. Smith again discussed the changing of the sulfur content of the water. Any changes of the system would need to be approved by Ohio Department of Health. Mr. Spriggs advised council on some of the legal aspects of this situation. It was decided that these should be discussed in an executive session. Deemer moved to go into an executive session. It was decided to take care of the other council business first so Deemer withdrew her motion.

Ray Friend was present to again discuss the EVS certification problem. We now have only $4\frac{1}{2}$ certified people. The present crew does not wish to take the entire course over again but would take a 27 hour refresher course. The need for replacement of the EVS vehicle also was discussed. Council gave firemen to use the fire vehicles for parades and to give school children rides. Council decided to not charge a Defiance patient who was picked up after the Defiance EVS broke down.

Rolland Kennedy reported on the cost for the sewer drain problem at Snook's.

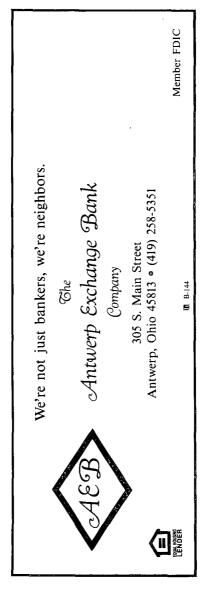
